Get the gist

- ✓ Capture the spirit of the text – what is it about?
- ✓ What is the purpose of this text?
- ✓ Who is the audience?
- ✓ Notice connections between ideas.
- ✓ What is the author's overall viewpoint?



Ask questions

- ✓ Pause and reflect on your reading – be inquisitive.
- ✓ Deepen your thinking.
- ✓ What do you want to know more about?
- ✓ What information has the author left out that puzzles you?
- ✓ Question decisions an author has made, eg word choices, style, bias.
- ✓ Ask 'what', 'why' and 'how' questions.
- ✓ Ask what the author wants you to feel, think, imagine and do.
